Dear Parents

There are a number of things to update you on this week, but please pay particular attention to the first item about the UCI Cycling event next week...

ALL YEAR GROUPS: Road Closures for UCI Cycling Event – Weds 25th September

All students were issued with a letter yesterday explaining the impact of the road closures around Bedale next Wednesday. The closures will affect buses, cars and taxis at the end of the school day. School is open as normal and arrangements are in place to supervise children until buses get through at approx. 3.45pm. After school, bus 73 (to Northallerton) will not operate until 4pm; the Masham bus (802) will leave at approximately 4.15pm and we expect the other school buses to be leaving at approximately 3.45pm. Parents who pick up students by car will not be able to get through to school before 3.45pm at the earliest.

If your child gets a school bus, the public bus, or needs to wait for you to come and collect them by car, we will make arrangements to supervise students in school until the usual transport is here. But if you have alternative arrangements in place, or if you would prefer to allow your child to leave at the normal time without supervision, please email admin@bedalehighschool.org.uk or phone on 01677 422419 to let us know. Please be aware that If we do not hear back from parents of these students, they will need to remain in school until the transport is here so that we can ensure their safety and account for their whereabouts.

I appreciate that this will cause some inconvenience and result in children arriving home a little later than normal, but given the alternative arrangements that are in place, there is absolutely no need to keep your child at home on this day – lessons will run as normal.

GIRLS' SKIRTS

Parents will know that we have put a lot of time into establishing a strong sense of pride in our new uniform, and I am very conscious of the support that you have shown to us over this issue, both in terms of helping us build the right ethos and through the fact that uniform can be a costly business for parents. I am now asking for support with one particular aspect girls' skirts. The vast majority of our girls wear them correctly and at a decent length. However, there are small groups, mainly within years 9-11, who roll up skirts at the waist, or tie knots in the waist band, and wear them very short. I will be speaking to the student leaders about this issue and seeing how we can tackle it in a positive way. As role models, they should have a key part to play in this. For me, it is not simply an issue of uniform discipline, but there may be more important underlying issues that we need to address such as body image and self-worth. For your part, I would be really grateful if parents could also have this discussion about why it is not appropriate to be wear the skirts so short, and the resulting problems that can arise from these situations. I'm confident that if we tackle it together positively from an educational point of view, then we should soon start to see an improvement which will benefit all concerned.
