We held the event in response to the Yr 7 Parent Questionnaire where a number of parents expressed concern about the amount of Homework that was being set for Year 7 students. I started by speaking about why we value homework, and linked this to the need for the early development of independent learning skills that will help to ensure students are well-equipped for the rigour of ever more challenging GCSEs. Mrs Knight then talked about the support streams available in school and Mr Gill recapped on how to use the Show My Homework app.

But the main point of the evening was to hear from parents, to listen to concerns and to discuss ideas that could help to give more assurance around the purpose of Homework and the processes around setting it and feeding back on work. We heard some really useful ideas, and some tough messages that it was important for us to listen to. I stand by the position that if students are helped to be really organised, and complete HW tasks on the day it is set, it is a reasonable workload that is well managed by the vast majority of students. That said, there were a number of really good suggestions and improvements from parents that we will now be looking at, covering a range of aspects such as how we feedback on homework, clarity of instructions and the type of task that is being set, amongst other things. My next step is to share feedback with staff, and to agree some actions moving forward that will hopefully lead to positive changes where needed.
