The honest answer is that we simply do not know. There is increasing speculation that schools may be asked to manage some sort of phased return where limited numbers of students are allowed in the building. We are yet to hear more on this and as you can imagine, we have many questions around when this would be, how it would work and which students it would involve. In preparation for such a scenario we have started to plan different models which we will share with the Local Authority in the hope that we are as well prepared as we can be, given the lack of information and guidance at this stage.

Who is school currently open for?

Every 2 weeks we contact our list of parents who are either key workers, forces families or have children who could be considered to be vulnerable. School is open to these children 'if they cannot stay safely at home'. Where parents are at home, in most cases they would be expected to keep their child at home unless there are specific reasons why this cannot work. We take in the children of key workers on the days when there is no one else to care for them at home.

Thank you to parents for keeping us up to date with their requirements - it helps us to ensure that the right provision is in place.






If it is at all possible for children to be at home, then they must be.

If a child needs specialist support, is vulnerable or has a parent who is a critical worker, then educational provision will be available for them.

Parents should not rely for childcare upon those who are advised to be in the stringent social distancing category such as grandparents, friends, or family members with underlying conditions.

Parents must also do everything they can to ensure children are not mixing socially in a way which can continue to spread the virus. They must observe the same social distancing principles as adults.

If your work is critical to the COVID-19 response, or you work in one of the critical sectors, and you cannot keep your child safe at home then your children will be prioritised for education provision.
