#### **Academic Welfare Meetings**

When we returned from the Easter holiday we carried out individual Academic Welfare 'checkin' meetings with Year 10 students and their parents. These were done virtually using Microsoft Teams, or where this was not possible, they were done through phone calls. The meetings were incredibly useful in helping us secure a clearer picture of where these students are at with their learning, and where we need to prioritise our support. On the back of this, I would now like to commit to carrying out a similar 'check-in' with each student (and parent where possible) in Years 7-9, before the end of this term. The reality is that holding 300 Teams meetings over the next few weeks will not be possible. So, what we are planning is a range of ways to carry out these interactions: phone-call interviews, written exchanges and Teams meetings. Further details to follow soon!



It has given us a massive lift to have more students back in school this week, and to be able to get back some of the normality we are all missing (students sitting in classrooms being taught!). I'd like to thank them all for their excellent behaviour and attitude; we've had a different group in Mon to Thurs but each group have conducted themselves impeccably. And strangely...each group seemed a little more cheerful than the day before! If you are a parent of a Yr 10 child who has not yet attended their designated morning...I urge you to consider booking them in. The feedback from staff and students has so far been really positive and the provision, although only a morning, is definitely helping to link together the school learning and home-learning.



#### Instructions for Teams Meetings

As I mentioned last week, following our staff training, increasing numbers of staff are trying to get to grips with the challenge of delivering virtual lessons (or similar formats such as recorded/narrated PowerPoints and videos). One of the most common platforms we are using is Microsoft Teams. This is because all students have access to it through their school Outlook email accounts. Mr Barnes has kindly produced a simple video guide (link opposite) to explain how you can access these lessons if a student has received an invitation through their school email. Please keep an eye out for these - they really are a great way to engage with learning remotely.

## Problems with student email accounts

Please be aware that a number of students' email accounts have suffered from virus attacks over the last couple of weeks. The reason for this may be because some students' activities online could be compromising their accounts through using unsafe apps. Or it could be links that pupils are clicking on (in which case it may not just be their school accounts that are being affected). If pupils are using a parent's details to log on to PCs then the parent's account may also be exposed. Some of the messages look like the ones opposite, but they make take other forms.
