We write to all schools to ask if they have any concerns for any students and to share that information with us. These students are then put on our transitional list and are contacted when they arrive to see if they need continued support around settling into college. All applicants will have all the same information sent to them and are invited in for connect to college in June. Any students who are vulnerable can come in for visits and schools liaison are doing bubble tours, which have been offered to the schools. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> From 21 June 2021, there will be a remote, online offer on the development of literacy and numeracy skills built around the GCSE syllabus. In addition there will be online training around how to use Google Suite which is used in college, including Google Classroom.
