Covid Testing Update

Hopefully you have seen some of the fabulous pics on Facebook from our first day of mass asymptomatic testing on Monday. Let's be honest...no school wants to be doing this right now. But I have to say that I was delighted with how it went. Mrs Riley-Fox and her team of parents, governors and staff did a phenomenal job. The students were also brilliant - it's easy to underestimate how daunting a process this may be for some, but they were calm, polite and cheerful throughout.

You may have also seen some media coverage around the testing in schools this week. Just in case you have not, I will try to clear up one of the questions that has come up most frequently. If your child tests positive with a test in school, you are no longer required to get an additional PCR test. However, if you do choose to get the additional test, and it comes back negative, your child (and other members of the household) will still need to self-isolate. This was not initially clear in the guidance but has since been confirmed by the DfE and the Local Authority. Following our final testing day on Monday 15th March, we will be moving to a home-testing model for students as per the DfE guidance. On Tuesday next week, students will be given testing kits to use at home. These will come with full guidance, but parents will also receive a

letter about this at the start of next week, once schools receive confirmation from the DfE about the arrangements. But we do know that with these tests, you are required to get a confirmatory PCR test if your child gets a positive result.




Maths Challenge Legends

Year 11 Update

Mr Gill held an assembly this week with Year 11 students to explain how their grades will be awarded this summer. We intend to use a 'basket of evidence' for each subject area. In other words, grades will be based on a number of key indicators: performance in PPE1, coursework, NEA work, in-class mini assessments and their forthcoming PPE2. Each subject area is sharing guidance with the students on exactly what they need to be revising and working on, and students are not going to be tested on any 'new' or untaught content.
