### **Alumni Visit**

#### Martvn Coombs writes:

Bedale High School ex pupil, Dr Catherine Mela (Burton) PhD FInstLM, gave a fascinating talk to Y9 students on Monday. She was inspired by science teacher Paul Scott who gave her the love of medicine and despite suffering from dyslexia, she secured her BTECs before moving on to university. Catherine has a PhD, in Medicine from Imperial College, London and is a fellow of the Institute of Leadership and Management. She worked in the NHS running clinical trials on HIV medication before moving into the pharmaceutical industry. She has worked in Africa, the Middle East, Finland, Thailand and shared a stage in Barcelona with Nelson Mandela.

She was headhunted from Roche by AstraZeneca where she is the Head of Biosamples. In the first few weeks of the pandemic, she was leading part of the work to establish viral testing for COVID-19 and to ensure the continued safe supply of AstraZeneca medicines to patients. In March 2020 she was given the task of setting up testing for Covid, a virus no one knew anything about and to create a vaccine to be given safely on a large scale. In just 10 months, she and her team managed to create the AZ vaccine which has rolled out millions of doses worldwide.

Catherine spoke about the need to identify the things you are good at and not to worry about the things that you can't do. She overcame problems at school to be a writer of journals and books and to deliver keynote speeches around the world. She finished with a short video showing the world of the future, where a smart watch can analyse things like the sweat from your wrist to identifying medical problems and creating virtual appointments with key doctors and consultants. She left the group thinking that some of the jobs they eventually go into, may not have even been invented yet. Her motto is 'Don't let perfect get in the way of good.'

Mrs Knight had to complete a range of assessments, exams and case studies to become a qualified practitioner. This work will now become part of our in-school provision and support for students who need it. It is designed to help professionals support young people with improving resilience and self-confidence, helping them manage behaviour, relationships, attendance or other aspects where they may be struggling.

# **Covid Testing**

We have been asked to share this update from the DfE regarding the use of regular Covid 19 tests:

Over 49 million rapid COVID-19 tests have been conducted by students and staff at schools and colleges across England since Monday 4 January. Building regular twice-weekly testing into routines has been critical in reaching this milestone number of tests and is testament to the dedication of students and staff to keep the virus out of schools and colleges.

"I am grateful and humbled by the actions that everyone working in education has taken to pull together and deliver this programme. Alongside the wider protective measures in place that we must all continue following, this asymptomatic testing helps break chains of transmission by taking people who are infectious but don't know it out of circulation."

#### Shop Service (we will be open on Saturdays from 24th July to 4th September inclusive)

Although restrictions affecting the opening of our shop have been lifted, we will continue to offer an appointment system as we did last year. This was so popular with parents because it ensured everyone had sufficient time to complete their purchases without having to wait in a large queue.

Our Click & Collect service will be fully operational, we have created a separate area so customers don't have come to the shop to collect their order. Click & Collect is located in the unit next door to our shop and will be clearly signed, from Monday 26<sup>th</sup> July to Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> September Click & Collect will be open from 8am to 8pm. You will not be able to place orders at the Click & Collect desk or purchase additional items

It is really important that you check the situation before visiting our shop over the summer. If you have a long journey to visit us we wouldn't want to have to turn you away because we couldn't accommodate you. Paramount to everything is the safety and welfare of our customers and staff.

#### Stock Availability, Cut off date & Ordering

Despite the pressures that have affected global product sourcing & manufacture, our careful planning has meant we have received much of our Back to School stock already and over the coming weeks to the end of June we will continue to receive incoming stock. We don't envisage any issues with stock availability during Back to school but the best way to ensure you have what you need, is to order early.

The cut off date for guaranteed delivery of online & telephone orders will be Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> July, if we have your order by that date we guarantee the order will arrive before school starts in September. Back to School is incredibly busy and we usually see orders increase from 10 or 15 per day to 250/300 orders per day, it simply isn't possible to increase staff numbers by the same factor so while we do take on temporary staff, we also increase our working hours and days but it will take longer than normal to process orders, so please bear with us during the Back to School period.

#### Contacting Schoolshop during Back to School

We understand that parents have questions relating to Back to School and this is an incredibly busy time for us, therefore before you contact us please check our website for answers to your questions. If you want to check stock of products just look online, if the product(s) is/are out of stock it will display there. Please don't contact us to ask for items to be put aside for you as we will not reserve items for customers because this is unfair on those who have made appointments and taken the time to come through to our shop.

If you return an item for exchange or refund please provide a mobile number and we will text you to confirm we have received the item so you know we are dealing with this.

If you can, please contact us via E-Mail as we can respond to this even after our telephone lines have gone onto night service.
