## **Alumni Visit**

Thankyou to Martyn Coombs for organising the latest visit and write up, and to Chris Carruthers for his support on the day:

This week's visit was with Year 7 students who got to meet BBC producer and former BHS student Mark Flowers. Mark has spent the last thirty years making Natural History programmes for the BBC and his first job was working with David Attenborough on 'The Private Life of Plants'. He then travelled the world to rainforests, deserts, mountains and oceans to film everything from elephants to penguins and orchids to oak trees. He talked about flying in Sheik's helicopters, filming movie stars, diving in submarines and sailing to Antarctic islands. He has filmed with the Queen, Alan Titchmarsh, Monty Don, Chris Packham and has built his life around filming the planets' natural wonders in the hope that people will love them and then help to save them.

Mark recalled his time at school singing and dancing in 'Joseph and His Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat' and 'Follow the Star' as well as playing the Cowardly Lion in the 'Wizard of Oz'. He drew parallels with the lion because he had to overcome his fears and worries about leaving home and travelling to far flung, remote places. He talked about having the courage to dream big, to have the commitment to make the dreams happen and the compassion to treat people well on the journey. Mark said he felt very lucky to have grown up in Little Crakehall, a beautiful part of the world and to go to such a supportive and brilliant school which really set him up for the rest of his life.

He said 'If anyone had told me what I have achieved in my life when I was at Bedale High School, I would never have believed them. It would have seemed an impossible dream. How

can a young lad from Crakehall end up working for David Attenborough and then travel the world for his job? Well, if I can, you can, and the school motto of courage, commitment and compassion could not be more true.' It all began with a tank of tropical fish in his bedroom at home! His motto is, you can never cross the ocean until you have the courage to lose sight of the shore.
