School Car Park

Please can I remind parents to avoid dropping off/collecting in the school car park at the start and end of each school day. The reasons for this are mainly around health and safety. We want to avoid situations where more traffic is around at the same time as students are arriving in school. It is all too easy to not see a child when you are reversing, or for a child to not notice a car backing out etc. Also, we only have a small carpark, and while teachers are usually in school well before 8.30, we have a number of staff who are not contracted to start until a bit later. They struggle to get into the car park when it is blocked with other vehicles. Finally, we have a lot of work going on in and around the site at the moment, which means more contractors' vehicles needing access to the school car park. Many thanks for your assistance with this.

Bus Issue: No. 73

We have been informed that the additional 73 bus that ran through last year has now been pulled. I have been in contact with both Proctors (who run this service) and North Yorks Passenger Transport. Unfortunately, because this is a wholly commercial service, it falls outside the responsibility for NY Passenger Transport. And because Northallerton technically falls outside our school catchment area, we are not entitled to a school bus to be provided. It has resulted in a very crowded bus, and a longer waiting time at the end of the school day for these students (since it does not arrive until about 3.35pm). I have been assured that Proctors are now trying to use a bigger vehicle when they can. And I have also put in a request to see if they can change the pickup timetable at the end of the day to bring it forward. I will keep you up to date on any developments.

Parents and Carers with children in years 5 and 6 are invited to attend our open evening and we will show you why we are among the **top performing schools in North Yorkshire.**






Wizard of Oz **Rehearsals**
