# **Covid Updates**

#### Vaccinations for 12-15 year olds

The School Age Immunisation Service (SAIS) have contacted the school this week to confirm that they will be offering Covid-19 vaccinations to 12-15 year old students in school <u>on October 21<sup>st</sup></u>. I have written to them to seek clarification on some aspects of how this process will work, and I will share this information as soon as I have it. Previous information has been shared in recent newsletters - please see the link below to see these.

#### **Positive Covid Cases**

Over the last week or so, we have remained fairly steady with the number of positive cases among students and staff, though this remains an ever-changing picture as some students return from self-isolation as others test positive and have to start self-isolating. However, over the course of today and Monday, we are expecting approximately half of our current self-isolating students to return to school, hopefully indicating that we may be through the worst of the recent rise in cases. The temporary measures we reinstated recently will remain in place and under review through consultation with the North Yorks Public Health team and in response to how the situation develops in school.

#### **Home Testing**

This remains a very important tool in our efforts to reduce the spread of Covid-19 in our school community. Please continue to ensure that all students test at least twice a week to support this process. We will continue to remind students about the importance of this, and Miss Riley-Fox is happy to help you with any questions or concerns that you may have around this: rileyfl@bedalehighschool.org.uk.

Overall, it was just fantastic for our students to return to learning outside the classroom - and a very enjoyable and stimulating time was had by all!
