### **Vaccinations and Covid Update**

#### Vaccinations for 12-15 year olds

The Schools Age Immunisation Service (SAIS) have assured us that they will be in touch to confirm the next visit when they will come into school to continue administering vaccinations to students (aged 12-15) with consenting parents. I hope that when this happens, they will be able to bring a larger team than last time and therefore be able to get through a greater number of students. I am sorry for the delay with this process, I know it is frustrating for parents who want their children to be vaccinated as soon as possible, but it is something that we have no control over as it is completely managed externally.

#### **Positive Covid Cases**

At the time of writing we have only 1 student who has tested positive and a couple of others who are awaiting results from a PCR. While it is pleasing to see this number so much smaller than a few weeks ago, we have learned to be wary when we return from any holiday which is when cases sometimes seem to spike again. We will maintain the current protocols of masks on corridors, hand sanitising on entry to rooms and wiping down classroom desks between classes for another week and then review to see how things are looking.

### Year 10 Citizenship Cancer Research GCSE – Important – Squat Challenge Exam News

#### Mr Childe writes:

Following a review of the learning journey for this subject, the decision has been made for all Year 10 students currently following the GCSE Citizenship course to sit their final external exams in Summer 2022, rather than Summer 2023.

Staff delivering the course are confident that there is ample to time to cover all of the necessary course content, and for a substantial revision programme (including a formal PPE) to take place prior to the exams next June. Students have been following the course since the beginning of Year 9, and even with the disruption caused by school closures, the majority of the course content has now been covered. This decision will also mean that additional time next year can be allocated to core areas of the curriculum - which will hopefully support and reassure students in preparation for their final exams.

Parents will receive a letter about this and subject teachers will be providing some more details about arrangements for this during Citizenship lessons next week - but please do not hesitate to contact Mr Childe if you have any concerns or would like further clarification about this: childea@bedalehighschool.org.uk.
