### **Covid Update**



#### **Covid Testing**

Students have been issued with more Covid testing kits this week. Please remember to keep testing them over the holiday period, and especially just before the return to school on the 5<sup>th</sup> January.

#### Daily Testing for contacts of Covid-19

<u>Quoted from Department for Education update</u>: From 14 December, a new national approach to daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 has been introduced. All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to18 years and 6 months, identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 - whether Omicron or not - should take an LFD test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating. Children under five years old do not need to take part in daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 and do not need to isolate.

Once notified by Test and Trace as a close contact, all eligible staff, pupils and students are strongly recommended to take a LFD each day for 7 days and report the results through the online reporting system and to their setting. If they test negative, they can continue to attend their education setting. Outside of the education setting, they should continue to follow national guidance. This approach should also be adopted over the Christmas holiday and on return in January.

#### **Return to School**

There is a lot of speculation in the media at this time about schools potentially having to close after Christmas at some stage. At the moment - this is pure speculation and schools have been told to plan to continue with face to face teaching, but to have contingency plans in place. I would like to reassure families that we have these plans in place should this situation arise, but we hope that they will not be needed.

### **Illness and Absences from School**

Please can I ask for parental support in reminding children of our protocols over illness in school. Once they have reported it to a member of staff, if it is serious enough to warrant further attention they will be escorted to the front desk and checked over by one of our First Aid staff. If necessary, parents will be contacted by school to come and collect any child who is too ill to be in school, or who is displaying any Covid symptoms.

It is vital that school remain the 'gate-keepers' for this system. In recent days we have had students calling parents directly to come and collect them, rather than going through the correct system in school. Such instances will be recorded as unauthorised absences moving forward.

Please can I also ask that parents with absent children contact school each and every day of the absence to confirm their status.

### Guidance for parents and carers on online sexual harassment and keeping children safe online

The Children's Commissioner is today launching a guide for parents and carers on online sexual harassment and how they can support children to stay safe online.

"The things I wish my parents had known" draws together advice from 16 to 21-year olds on how parents should manage tricky conversations around sexual harassment and access to inappropriate content, including pornography.



The Commissioner's office began a programme of work focussing on peer-on-peer abuse following the avalanche of testimonies on the Everyone's Invited website, which laid bare an epidemic of sexual violence among teens. This was picked up in Ofsted's June 2021 review of sexual harassment in schools and colleges.

A surprising but overriding message from young people is that parents should start these challenging conversations early. They suggest broaching topics before a child is given a phone or a social media account, which is often around the age of 9 or 10.

The Children's Commissioner would be grateful for the support of schools and colleges in disseminating this guide to as many parents and carers as possible. She hopes that her guide will serve as a useful starting point to raise awareness and understanding of online harassment, and to complement key messages on the new relationships and sex education curriculum.
