Alumni Visits Continue

Martyn Coombs writes: Ex-student Simon Grayson visited Bedale High School recently to talk to Y8 and Y9 pupils about his career. His playing days saw him transfer to Leicester City, Aston Villa, Blackburn Rovers and finally to Blackpool but it was at Leicester where he achieved success winning two play-off finals at Wembley, the League Cup and where he was voted Player of the Season as captain. In all, he played 433 games scoring 11 goals.

Simon emphasised the importance of commitment in everything you do. As a footballer, he had to dedicate himself to being the best player he could, which often meant missing out on lots of things his friends were doing. A move into management at Blackpool saw him win the Football League Trophy and the play off at Wembley before his dream move to boyhood club Leeds United where again, he won promotion. Promotions as a manager followed at Huddersfield Town and Preston North End before his appointment as manager at Sunderland.

Simon's former PE teacher Martyn Coombs said 'When Simon played for my Y7 school team when he was in Y6 at Bedale CE Primary School, I never dreamed he would go on to manage the club I have supported all my life. It was just a pity it only lasted 3 months because I'm sure, given time, he would have been a great success.'

Simon is now keeping very busy with his media work with Talk Sport and Sky.

He said, 'It's hard to believe it is 36 years since I last set foot in the school, and it is wonderful to see the school motto of courage, commitment and compassion which happen to be the three qualities that have guided me through my life as a professional footballer and manager.'

Congratulations to Connor Fox in Year 11: Member of Youth Parliament!



During one of their PSHE sessions before February half-term, every student at Bedale High School participated in the UK's Youth Parliament's 'Make Your Mark' campaign organised by the British Council.

This campaign is a unique opportunity to reach out to young people who go on to be opinion formers and leaders of the future. Make Your Mark gives all young people aged 11-18 in the UK the chance to have a say on the biggest issues facing young people. It is Supported by over 780 schools, colleges, youth groups, and Council across the UK and is supported by BBC Children in Need, National Lottery Community Fund, Paul Hamlyn Foundation, and the Department for Digital, Culture, Media & Sport. The results will be used to decide what the UK Youth Parliament should campaign on in 2022-24.

Every student voted for a topical issue that they felt passionately about, and their favourite candidate to represent our area based upon an analysis of their manifestos; Connor had been short-listed as one of four candidates.

Last week, the school was delighted to hear that the votes from around **11,000 students** had been counted, and Connor had been elected Member of Youth Parliament for the Central North Yorkshire region! He will soon be receiving his MYP induction training, followed by a visit to the Houses of Parliament later in the year.


