Year 11s - Crunch Time!

Students urged to make the most of Easter Revision support

We held an assembly with Year 11 students yesterday to update them on how things are looking following the publication of Year 11 reports and the PPE2 exam data.

While many of them are conscientiously making the most of every opportunity to fully prepare for the upcoming GCSE exams, our data suggests that a group of Yr 11 boys are 'coasting' rather than hitting top gear, and in some cases not taking responsibility for their independent learning and revision.

We are really lucky to be part of a school community where staff give up a lot of extra time for additional revision support classes. And even at the end of an exhausting term, we have a number of teachers who are coming into school during the holiday to offer yet more revision classes for these students (see timetable attached).

We know from previous years that this holiday period can be a fantastic opportunity for students to really get to grips with an organised revision programme. What might this look like? We recommend 4×45 -minute sessions a day, which if managed carefully, still leaves plenty of time for all the other activities that help to keep them stress free and well-balanced in the lead up to the exams. We do not want students to be working '24/7' - the right balance is vital. But part of not feeling stressed about the exams comes from the confidence of feeling well prepared - which only comes through a conscientious approach to study and revision.

We ask parents to support them in this over the next two weeks, and thank you to all of you who attended Mr Gill's virtual revision support evening last night (the 3rd one we have run for parents over recent months).




Bedale FC vs Celebs!

Year 7 Geographers – resilience in the face of extreme conditions!

Mr Childe writes about the recent fieldtrip to Flamborough:

Last week, all of our Year 7 Geographers participated in the annual fieldtrip to the Holderness Coast. The purpose of this visit was for the students to see for themselves some of the landforms, management strategies and impacts of coastal erosion that we have been learning about in class; in addition to this, it was really encouraging to see all of our core values on display as the students braved the weather and supported each other up and down cliffs, and along the 5km stretch of coastal path between Flamborough Head and South Landing. To begin with, students ventured down the steep footpath to Selwicks Bay at Flamborough Head to explore a number of coastal features including the sea stack, sea arches, caves and wave-cut platform (not to mention, getting some shelter from the wind!). Then, after a packed lunch, the students walked along the cliff-top path to South Landing via High Stacks, where the beach had been populated by a bob of seals. After a brief detour to Bridlington to have a look at the sea defences, we finished the day with a trip to Skipsea - where the rate of coastal erosion was quite breath-taking!

After the trip, the students commented on how the trip has 'brought to life' some of the concepts that had been covered in their Geography lessons - but did request that the next trip might include an ice-cream stop as a reward for being such committed students!
