However, in our area, there are a range of national and locally-funded support forums for children and young people which are now embedded, including:

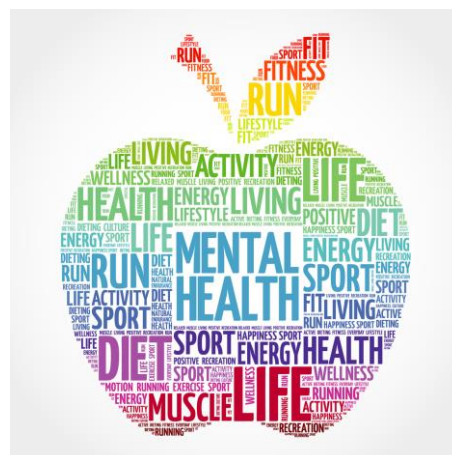

Buzz Us Text Messaging Service - confidential advice, support and signposting from a wellbeing worker within one working day via text for young people aged 11-18 across North Yorkshire and York.

Duke of Edinburgh Feedback

I really want to share the letter we have received below which is a fantastic example of the positives that can come from participating in our Duke of Edinburgh scheme overseen by Mrs Wilson in school.

Dear Mr. Kelly,

Many thanks for letting Bedale Juniors have some of your Duke of Edinburgh participants, it really helps the club and gives something back to the community. This season I have had the pleasure of working with several DOE pupils. Max McCafferty and Olly Schofield attend our Bumble bees sessions on a

Saturday morning @ 9.00 am, however, this is the start time and Max and Olly have to be there at 8.20 am to set up. They work with our 3-5-year-olds encouraging them to learn our great game in a fun environment. In the last few months, they have been given the task of organizing and planning sessions for which they will lead a group of children. This is no easy feat, but the children who attend absolutely love their enthusiasm and I can hear the sound of laughter across the field when the boys are doing the session. Bedale Bumble bees were nominated for a FA North Riding award and only just missed out on winning. The boys played a huge part in getting us nominated. I also have had Sam Atkinson and Kieron Wilkinson helping us at the U6s. These two have been amazing. From turning up as two shy kids to now leading and running complicated sessions has been a joy to watch. For the last 4 weeks, they have each managed a team in matches, instructing and encouraging the team to victory. They help with setting up all the equipment, moving goals, and then clearing it away. They were supposed to be with us for 8 weeks but have stayed till the end of the season which must be about 15 weeks. We will surely miss them. At the end of each session for U6 and Bees, we give out trophies to a child who has shone. All the DOE children at first used to be quiet and you could hardly hear them talk, they have built their confidence up over time and now deliver a confident speech for why they chose that child.

I just wanted to drop this line as teenagers get a hard press these days, but your pupils have been amazing and deserve a mention. They have been polite throughout the season, never late, always thoughtful towards the children, and a huge help.


Hello, my name is Connor Fox.

Currently in the uk 22.5% of pupils are eligible for free school meals with child poverty groups reporting 800,000 pupils missing out on free school meals i hope to change that figure for North yorkshire and the wider area.
