Not My Child Campaign

NotMyChild



Leah from Northallerton was 15 when she lost her life in a car park after taking two 'MDMA bombs' (a powder form of Ecstasy).

Leah's mum Kerry and Commissioner Zoë are working together to encourage parents, guardians and care givers in York and North Yorkshire, to have **early and positive conversations with their children about drugs and other substances** to help prevent them from coming to harm.







This campaign has recently been launched by NY Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Zoe Metcalfe, together with Kerry Roberts (mother of 15 year-old Leah who died after taking drugs in 2019, in Northallerton).

The campaign aims to encourage parents, guardians and carers to have positive conversations with their teenage children about drugs, alcohol and other substances, before any harm has happened.

The month-long campaign was inspired by the tragic story of Kerry's daughter Leah who died after taking drugs in 2019.

Leah was 15 when she lost her life in a car park in Northallerton after taking two 'MDMA bombs' (a powder form of Ecstasy), whilst with a group of friends.

Kerry wanted to help other parents to have proactive and positive conversations with their children about drugs and alcohol and so has teamed up with Commissioner Zoe to create the "NotMyChild" campaign. Full details are available at www.notmychild.info

We have now been awarded the NY Healthy Schools Silver Award!

<u>Childline</u> - free, confidential, anonymous 24/7 service for anyone under 19 in the UK with any issue including emotional and mental health.

<u>YoungMinds</u> Textline - free, 24/7 text support for young people across the UK experiencing a mental health crisis, with texts answered by trained volunteers supported by experienced clinical supervisors <u>Buzz Us Text Messaging Service</u> - confidential advice, support and signposting from a wellbeing worker within one working day via text for young people aged 11-18 across North Yorkshire and York.

Restart A Heart Day

Last Friday, Bedale High School joined 149 schools from across Yorkshire in holding the annual Restart A Heart Day - with every Year 7 student taking part in the event. The students showed a lot of commitment as they were trained in what to do when they come across someone who has had a cardiac arrest - and how to deliver CPR which could potentially save their life. There have been several highprofile instances in the media over the past year or so where CPR has indeed saved someone's life - and hopefully the training given last week will provide our students with the confidence and courage to deliver CPR to someone if they needed to; this also included a demonstration about how to operate a defibrillator should any of the students were ever in a position that required them to do so. It was a great day, and we were fortunate to have the expertise of 5 volunteers from external organisations, including the Fire Service,









Community First Responders and a Paramedic to support the delivery of this important lifesaving training. Students were also given an opportunity to speak to volunteers about their own training and experiences which links in with our whole-school Careers Programme. David Emison and his team of volunteers provided some really positive feedback at the end of the day, commenting on how engaged and enthusiastic our students were - well done Year 7!

Year 8 Malham Cover Trip

Earlier this week, all of our Year 8 students participated in a Geography fieldtrip to Malham in the Yorkshire Dales National Park. This trip coincided with the work that the Year 8's had been doing during the first half-term as part of the 'From Rock to Soil' topic. The visits stretched over two days, and whilst the weather was significantly more 'challenging' on Day 2, it was

really encouraging to see the level of courage and commitment to brave the elements and complete the 8km circular walk that included the limestone pavement of Malham Cove, across fields to Gordale Scar and the fantastic Janet's Foss waterfall. The students commented about how much more impressive and memorable it was seeing this landscape first-hand (rather than just on a photograph in the classroom), and despite the weather at times, found this to be a very rewarding opportunity to learn outside the classroom.
