Restart A Heart Day – Year 7



World Restart A Heart Day actually falls on 16th October, but we will be holding our annual Restart A Heart Day on Friday 14th October.

A team of five volunteers (from Yorkshire Ambulance, St. John's Ambulance and Community First Responders) will be coming into school for the day to deliver CPR training to every single Year 7 student.

The following text taken from the website explains why this event carries so much importance:

Why is it important?

Approximately 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests happen every year in the UK. Sadly, less than 1 in 10 people survive these cardiac arrests. Performing CPR can more than double the chances of survival in some cases. For more info, please visit:

Year 7 PSHE Trip to Bradford

Mr Childe writes: Last week, all of our Year 7 students, in their new tutor groups, visited Bradford as part of the Religious Education strand of their PSHE Programme. The focus of the day was 'interfaith' - developing compassion for different religions, and two contrasting places of worship were visited.

The first place that we visited was the Madni Masjid (or 'mosque'), one of the main masajid in Bradford, serving the local Muslim communities. Our guide led us through the 'wudu' (the Islamic for cleansing parts of the body), the features of the prayer halls (such as the 'Mihrab' arch - which faces east, in the direction of the Kaa'ba in the city of Mecca) and the times and details of the five prayers that take place during the day.


For our second visit, we went to the Lakshmi Narayan Temple, the largest Hindu temple (or 'mandir') in Northern England. Our guide, Seema, took us into the Main Hall, where the students were fortunate to witness the temple priest deliver a service - an unforgettable experience! The students were able to explore the shrine, learn much about the Hindu faith from Seema and immerse themselves in the calm and tranquillity of the building. Following our packed lunch break at a local community centre, we visited Bombay Stores - the UK's largest Asian department store! Throughout the three days of visits, the student were wonderful ambassadors for the school - and on returning, I was delighted to open an email from Fatima Ayub (one of guides at the masjid), who commented:

"The children are a credit to your school. They were so respectable, sensible and engaging. Absolutely fantastic! Wow!"
