# Year 8 Geography Trip To Malham

**Mr Childe writes:** In the final week of the half-term, all of our Year 8 students participated in a Geography fieldtrip to Malham in the Yorkshire Dales National Park. This trip enriched the work that they had been doing during the first half-term for the 'From Rock to Soil' topic. The visits stretched over three days, and whilst the weather was significantly more 'challenging' on Day 3, it was really encouraging to see the level of courage and commitment to brave the elements and complete the 8km circular walk that began with a climb up to see the limestone pavement on top of Malham Cove: a landform that was formed by a waterfall carrying meltwater from glaciers at the end of the last Ice Age more than 12,000 years ago. After lunch, we then went (via the ice cream van) to witness the spectacular landform of Gordale Scar, which contains two waterfalls and has overhanging limestone cliffs over 100 metres high. We then finished our day at the beautiful and atmospheric Janet's Foss waterfall. The students agreed that it was much more engaging and informative seeing a landscape first-hand, and they found the visit to be a very rewarding opportunity to learn outside the classroom.



# **New Routines**

Some of our parents and families may not be aware that the school has grown significantly over the past year or so. In fact, we now have almost 100 additional students than we did in the summer of 2022. This is a testament to all of the hard work that has been undertaken by students, staff and the families within our school community, and to the actions that have been taken to ensure that BHS is the automatic secondary school of choice for families within our area.

Now that we have had a few weeks to look at the impact of having more bodies in the building, we have, at the start of this week, delivered assemblies to every year group to clarify some new routines that will affect all of us in school on a daily basis. The two key areas that are affected are movement around school and the start/end of lessons. We have scrapped the one-way system that was formerly in place (mainly from Covid), and instead changed to a single file movement system. Any of you who have visited school will understand how narrow our corridors are, and the impact of more and more students coming to us means that we have to manage the regular movement of hundreds of people in a really safe and effective way. I shared with students the rationale behind these decisions, and it is already clear that they are having a positive impact on the school in terms of how it feels during those busy transition times. We have also tweaked how we aim to start and end lessons to ensure that staff are 'owning their spaces' around the classroom to encourage and promote the calm arrival and departure of students.

I would like to thank our students and staff for the positive response they have given to these changes. It does require more patience at times to allow small queues of students to calmly access stairways and corridors, but these move quickly and more safely than was possible with the previous system. We will continue to review it as it becomes embedded and keep you up to date with any further changes. I have attached some of the key slides from our assemblies here.




#### **Join Our Quest to Promote Reading!**




#### **Uniform Issues?**
