Thank You and Farewell

As I start to pull together my last ever newsletter at BHS (next week will just be a quick end of term update), it is truly difficult to know what to say. My staff here would tell you, if they are honest, that I struggle to speak coherently when I feel emotional about something...so I am very grateful that I can write this instead of having to say it to your faces (public blubbering is never a good look!).

I feel that I have been blessed to have had the opportunity to work at this school for the last seven years - first as a Deputy Headteacher and then as Headteacher. My dad was a Headteacher, and though he died many years back, he remains (alongside Marcelo Bielsa!) my biggest influence. He loved being a Headteacher. But by his own admission, he probably stayed in the job too long. I promised him that I would not do this, and that I would leave at a point when it felt right.

I have been very fortunate throughout my career to work in schools where the local community is valued, where students inspire, and where staff forge strong friendships (to support this point, I can tell you that if you are reading this on Friday evening, I will be enjoying a pint of real ale with friends from Thirsk School where I left about 12 years ago, as I do every week at this time!). But there is something different and special about this Bedale community. It may be because it is on a smaller scale to some of the other places I have worked, - so inevitably you get to know people more quickly and relationships are vital to move things forward. But it's more than that. We serve a really interesting and vibrant community: forces families, farming families, local business owners and so on ... but one thing that has always struck me in my time here is that there is a very strong desire to feel proud of your local high school. Of course you want your children to do well, like all parents do, but it goes beyond this. Whenever we face difficult moments or challenges, your messages of support flood in. And it's not just your words, - you support us in your actions.

Your children are such impressive young people. I become very frustrated when some of the lazier sections of the media report the latest distressing example of teenagers behaving in a shocking or offensive manner. If their reporting was more proportionate and objective, we would hear more about the endless examples of their compassionate service to others, and the courage

they show in taking on challenges to grow and develop themselves. For a small school, we have an excellent record in public service achievements, student council influence, sporting success, Duke of Edinburgh engagement, student leadership, outreach work, school productions and so on. Yes we are really lucky in that we have so many staff who are willing to give up their time for all of this - but it really only works because your children want to be a part of it. When visitors or interview candidates come to the school, they often say to me 'I really like your courage, commitment and compassion values that you have in school'. My response is always to say that they are not my values - they are *our* values - lived and showcased every single day by your children, and by this amazing group of staff.

So what about the staff? We have people here who have served this community for much longer than I have. Speak to them and you cannot fail to understand how much Bedale High School means to them. Their passion and loyalty to the school is something very precious and valuable. In a school this size, every role matters: the site team, admin support, front desk staff, data-handlers, catering, technicians, teaching assistants, cleaning team, finance, pastoral support, business management, exams, attendance and teachers. People tend to think the school day is all about lessons - but the work of all of these other people is crucial in enabling the school to function effectively and to support all of our students.

I would also like to thank our team of school governors. Unless you are directly involved with them, it is difficult to appreciate just how much time, energy and commitment they give to this school. They have been a massive support to me since my appointment as Deputy Headteacher, then as interim Head, and then putting their trust in me to do the job on a permanent basis. They have supported my ideas and never lose sight of the fact that we are here to serve our local community. Like you, and like our staff, they are passionate about helping the school continue to move in the right direction.

People keep asking me what I plan to do next. In fact my wife is particularly keen to know (she recently commented 'You know you're not retiring don't you? You're supposed to be getting another job?'). The truth is I don't yet know what my next steps will be. It is scary but also quite exciting. I've finally come to terms with the fact that I'm never going to play for Leeds United and I feel like this new-found maturity is a positive sign for my future development.

Enough waffling. I would like to say a very genuine thank-you to everyone in this wonderful and supportive community. I truly have been very lucky to work here. Next Friday will be a very emotional day for me and I will be limiting my conversations to monosyllabic grunts in order to avoid any overt shows of emotion! The school has changed in many positive ways over recent years, and this is down to you, our staff and your amazing children. They make me laugh every day and I will miss their humour, their energy and their enthusiasm. Don't let anyone tell you that the youth of today are the problem. They are not the problem - they are the hope. And I am constantly in awe of them.

I thank you, your children, our staff and governors, our business friends and alumni, and the many other patrons and supporters we have in this wonderful community. I wish you all the very best for the future.

EARLY FINISH NEXT FRIDAY



Uniform can be ordered any time throughout the summer, but to guarantee you have your uniform in time for school starting in September please ensure we have your order by 29th July.


Due to the volume of orders received it can take up to 2-3 weeks to process orders which are placed during Back to School.
