- Advice from a parent from last year.

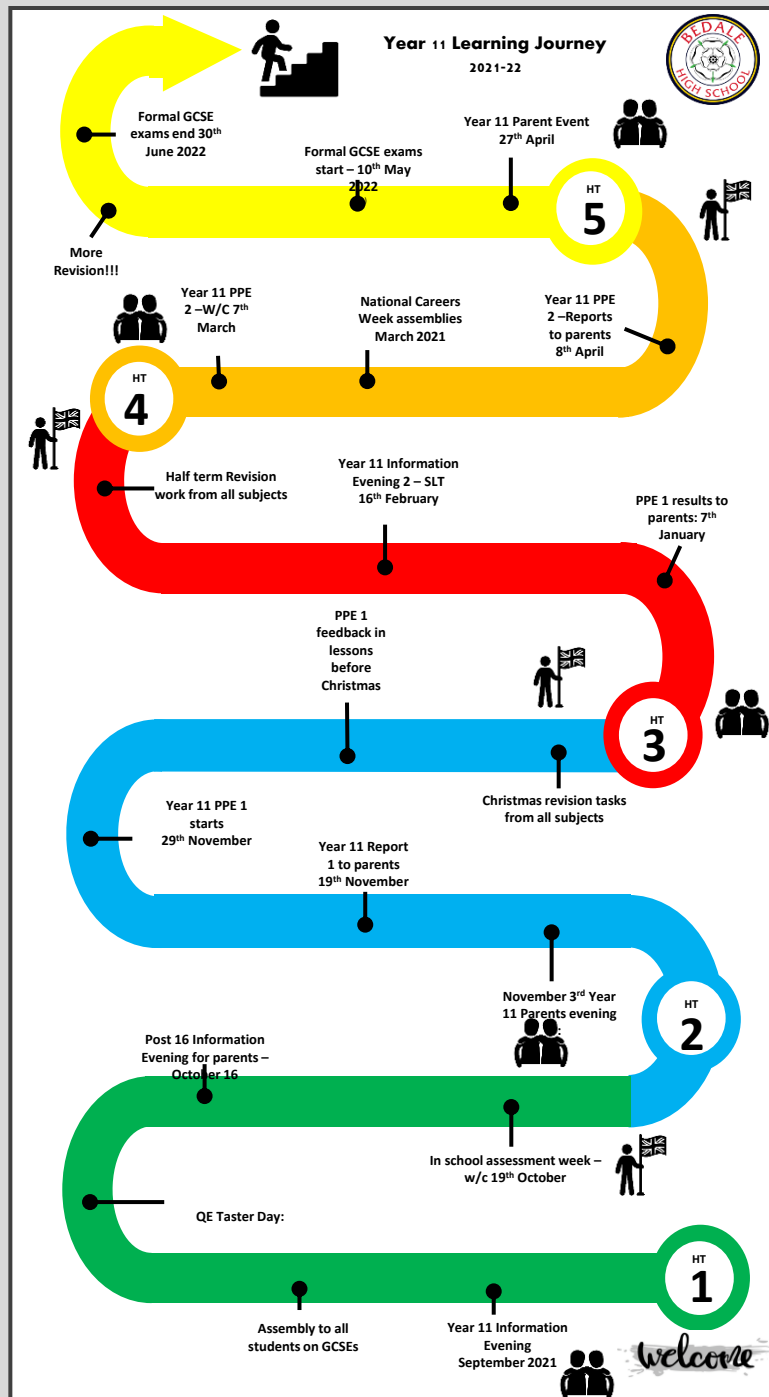
